On the amendment to the Rules of Origin for developing and least developed countries and submission of certificates of origin in the context of the spread of coronavirus infection 2019-nCov

In accordance with paragraph 3 of Article 37 of the Treaty on the Eurasian Economic Union dated May 29, 2014, paragraph 5 of Article 314 of the Customs Code of the Eurasian Economic Union and paragraph 12 of the Annex to the Regulation of the Eurasian Economic Commission approved by Decision No. 98 of the Supreme Eurasian Economic Council dated December 23, 2014, in relation to the implementation of the EAEU Member States measures aimed at preventing the spread of coronavirus infection 2019-nCov, the Council of the Eurasian Economic Commission has decided:

1. In the first indent of paragraph 30 of the Rules of origin for developing and least developed countries, approved by the Decision No. 60 of the Council of the Eurasian Economic Commission dated June 14, 2018, the words «in the case specified in paragraph 35 of these Rules of origin» to replace by the words «except in the cases specified in paragraph 35 of these Rules of origin and in the Decision No. 36 of the Council of the Eurasian Economic Commission dated April 3, 2020 «On the amendment to the Rules of Origin for developing and least developed countries and submission of certificates of origin in the context of the spread of coronavirus infection 2019-nCov»».

2. From the date of entry into force of this Decision to September 30, 2020 inclusively, an electronic or paper copy of the certificate of origin may be submitted in order to confirm the origin of goods for the purposes provided for in paragraph 3 of Article 37 of the Treaty on the Eurasian Economic Union dated May 29, 2014, subject to the obligatory subsequent submission of their originals no later than 6 months from the date of registration of the declaration of goods. In this case, the declarant shall make a statement (in any form by printing or handwriting) on the reverse side of the copy of certificate of origin, which guarantees the subsequent submission of the original certificate of origin to the customs authority within the above-mentioned period.

3. If the original certificate of origin is not submitted within the time period specified in paragraph 2 of this Decision, the origin of the goods will be considered as unconfirmed.

4. This Decision shall enter into force after 10 calendar days from the date of its official publication.
